



Summit 6 Announces Federal Lawsuit Over Digital Uploading Patents

DALLAS — Dallas-based technology provider Summit 6 LLC recently filed suit against HTC, LG, Motorola, Apple, and Twitter to protect and enforce its intellectual property rights related to U.S. patents, 6,895,557, 7,765,482, and 8,612,515. The case was filed as no. 7:14-cv-00014 in the Northern District of Texas and assigned to Judge O'Connor. Attorneys for Summit 6 requested a jury trial.

Summit 6 believes that the defendants are using its technology without permission to produce and sell devices and/or operate online services where photos and other media are pre-processed and sent elsewhere.

The Summit 6 team includes inventors who originally filed for the patents and managers who brought the technology to market at PictureWorks Technology, and later at Internet Pictures Corporation (IPIX) and AdMission Corporation.

Through years of focused effort and investment, Summit 6's patented technology has been successfully utilized, under license, by well over 100 companies, representing billions of users, including device manufacturers, publishers, marketplaces, banks, and social networks in the United States and around the world.

In other recent news, Summit 6 won its previous lawsuit against Samsung, which also involved the '482 patent. A North Texas jury found the patent valid and infringed, awarding Summit 6 \$15 Million in damages. The remaining defendants—Facebook, Photobucket, Multiply, and Blackberry (formerly Research in Motion)—took licenses to the technology before trial. The case is currently on appeal.

Dallas-based Summit 6 LLC provides media upload technology to device manufacturers, and providers of online services. Its patented technology has been licensed by some of the world's most recognized, and successful companies, and is utilized by billions of users around the world every day.
